Recognizing Vowel Team Syllables

Advanced Decoding: Multisyllabic Word The purpose of this activity is for students to recognize that every vowel team syllable has two or more vowels.

Prepare

- Print out the Vowel Team Syllable poster from the <u>6 Syllable Types</u> Classroom Poster Set.
- Print out the two header cards Vowel Team Syllable and NOT Vowel Team Syllable from the <u>Syllable Header Cards</u>. Make one copy for each student and one copy for yourself.
- Print out the <u>Syllable Spiral Cards</u>. Refer to the <u>Syllable Spiral Cards</u> Answer Key.

Warm-Up



Remember that longer words are made up of smaller word parts called syllables. We can break up longer words into syllables to help us read them.

Show the vowel team Syllable Poster from the <u>6 Syllable Types</u> <u>Classroom Poster Set</u>. A Vowel Team syllable is a word part that contains one vowel followed by one or more vowels side by side. Since there are *two* or more vowels side by side, it makes it a Vowel Team syllable. Let's first do a quick review of some common vowel teams and the sound they make together.

- 1. Write ai, ay, ee, ea, au, aw, oo, oi, oy, oa on the board, and point to them as you say the long vowel sound.
- 2. Let's say the sounds for each of these vowel teams:

```
ai, ay \rightarrow /A/
ee, ea \rightarrow /E/
au, aw \rightarrow /au/
oo \rightarrow long /oo/ as in boot, or short /oo/ as in book
oi, oy \rightarrow /oy/
oa \rightarrow /O/
ou, ow \rightarrow /ow/
igh \rightarrow /I/
```

Today, we will be looking at syllables and deciding if they fit the pattern for a vowel team syllable.

Recognizing Vowel Team Syllables

Modeling

We have different syllable types on these cards and two piles in which to sort them: Vowel Team Syllable and NOT Vowel Team Syllable. Show students the two cards for sorting.

Our goal is to recognize the vowel team syllable pattern. If I find a vowel team syllable, I will place it in the Vowel Team Syllable pile. If it is not a vowel team syllable, I will place it in the NOT Vowel Team Syllable pile. It might be one of the five other syllables types.

First, let's look at this syllable. My turn, watch me. Place the *leef* syllable in front of students.

- 1. I spot the first vowel (point to the vowel). I have one vowel (point to the e), followed by another vowel (point to the second e), so this is a vowel team syllable.
- 2. I will put it in the Vowel Team Syllable pile.

I'm going to model another one for you. Place the *cuf* syllable in front of students. **My turn, watch me.**

- I spot the vowel (point to the u). I spot a consonant f (point to the f). I do not have one vowel followed by one or more vowels side by side, so this can't be a vowel team syllable because it does not follow our pattern of one vowel followed by one or more vowels side by side.
- 2. This is not a vowel team syllable. I will put it in the NOT Vowel Team Syllable pile.

Guided Practice



Let's try some together. Pass out the Header Cards to each student. Choose a vowel team syllable card (e.g., *taig*). Have students work with you to recognize if it is a vowel team syllable.

- 1. I spot the vowel. Point to it.
- 2. There is one vowel followed by one or more vowels side by side. Point to the i.
- 3. Is this a vowel team syllable or not? Raise your green card if it is a vowel team and your red card if it is not a vowel team syllable. Check students' cards. This is a vowel team syllable, so I will place it in the Vowel Team Syllable pile. Point to the pile in which it belongs.

If Correct: Fantastic, you are correct. It is a vowel team syllable because we have one vowel followed by one or more vowels side by side.

If Incorrect: Let's review the rule again. I have one vowel followed by one or more vowels side by side (*point to the vowels*), so this is a vowel team syllable. I will put it in the vowel team Syllable pile.

To increase student engagement, show the syllable, provide wait time, and then call on individually selected students or on the whole group.

Try to get a correct response before proceeding.

Guided Practice Continued

Repeat with a few more syllables: vowel team (e.g., *oap*) and not vowel team (e.g., *om*, *arg*, or *-zle*).

Practice



Your turn to try it on your own. I'm going to show you a syllable. I'll give you time to look at it and decide whether or not it's a vowel team syllable, and then I'll say, "Go!" If it's a vowel team syllable, raise your green Vowel Team Syllable card. If it's not a vowel team syllable, raise your red NOT Vowel Team Syllable card. Wait for my "Go!" signal before raising your card.

Show a syllable card and allow three to five seconds of wait time. Then say, "Go!" Provide corrective feedback and point to the two or more vowels combined if it is a vowel team syllable. Watch for students who give incorrect responses, and switch from whole group response to individual student response. After the group agrees on the syllable type, place the card in the correct pile.

Support

If students are still struggling with identification, use only vowel team syllable cards. Have students point to the vowels and repeat the rule for a vowel team syllable.

Challenge

Have students decode the following multisyllabic words with vowel team syllables: *raindrop*, *peanut*, *enjoy*, *roadside*, *sunray*, *fireman*.

A syllable in which one vowel is followed by one or more consonants. The vowel will make a short vowel sound.

A syllable in which one vowel is followed by one consonant then silent-e. The first vowel will make a long vowel sound.

A syllable in which one vowel is followed by consonant "r". The vowel sound is "controlled" by the "r".



Vowel Team

A syllable containing one vowel followed by one or more vowels or consonants side by side that produce one vowel sound.

Consonant-le



C-le

An unaccented final stable syllable containing a consonant and –le. The vowel sound produced will be the schwa.





